



Q.1: Community members have meaningful input on school budgeting.





Q.2: Community members have had meaningful input into how federal COVID response funds are being used.









Q.1: How frequently did your school communicate with families compared to last year?




Q.2: How often did you meet with families this year (both in person and virtually)?





Q.3: How effective do you feel in your interactions with parents/guardians?











Q.1: How much feedback did you receive on your teaching this year?




Q.2: How useful do you find the feedback you receive on your work?






Q.4: What evaluation(s) do you find most effective to improve your practice? (Select all that apply)
























Q.2: How positive are the attitudes of your colleagues?




Q.4: When new initiatives are presented at your school, how supportive are your colleagues?







Q.7: To what degree do student behaviors at your school interfere with teaching and learning?




Q.8: How well do administrators at your school create a school environment that helps students learn?





Q.1: How positive is the tone that school leaders set for the culture of the school?





Q.2: Overall, how positive is the influence of the school leaders on the quality of your teaching?





Q.4: How knowledgeable are your school leaders about what is going on in teacher's classrooms?






Q.5: How responsive are school leaders to your feedback?












Q.6: Do you feel that student bullying this year is worse than prior to the pandemic?




Q.7: How likely is it that a student at your school will be bullied?










Q.2: How satisfied do you feel with the time you have for staff collaboration?



Q.3: How satisfied do you feel with the time you have for planning and preparing instruction?




Q.4: How much do you feel the school values your opinions?




Q.5: How far behind academically, if at all, are your students?


Q.6: How knowledgeable are you regarding where to find resources for working with students who have unique learning needs?



Q.7: How often do instructional materials in your school encourage students to learn about a broad range of people from different races, ethnicities, geographies, and cultures?




