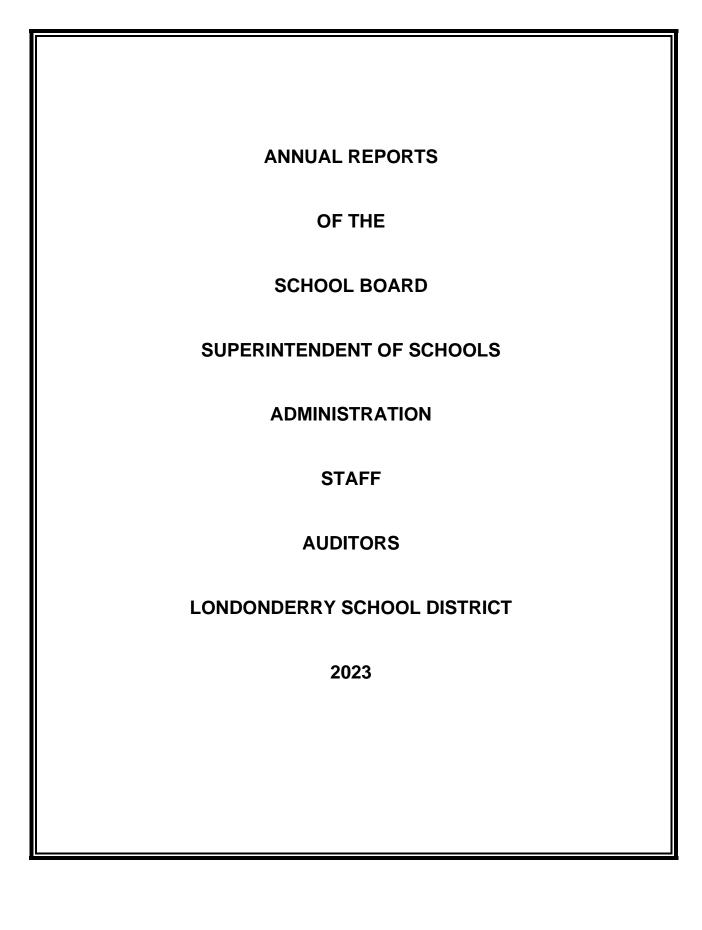

#### REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD CHAIRPERSON

It has been an honor and privilege to serve the students and community of Londonderry as a Board member. The School Board continues to work with the Superintendent to make sure Londonderry students can achieve the highest academic results and to make sure we are preparing all of our students for college and career-readiness.

We continue to build off the Londonderry School District Strategic Plan, looking for ways to use competency and assessment by performance to evaluate that our students are learning and growing in the most productive ways.

The Board reflects on the following achievements and is proud to share:

- \*90% of the 2023 graduating class was accepted to 2- and 4-year colleges.
- \*.27% LHS dropout rate with a graduation rate of 93.07 for the Class of 2023.
- \*12 AP Courses, with an enrollment of 473.
- \*24 Honors Courses, with an enrollment of 1050.
- \*15 Project Running Start Programs, with an enrollment of 550.
- \*22 Dual-credit Courses, with an enrollment of 882.
- \*NH Scholars Programs, with a total of 224 Scholars.
- \*94 Seniors were members of NHS, with a total of over 200 LHS NHS chapter members.
- \*72 Seniors earned Red Cords for Civic Involvement.
- \*LHS was the first Purple Star School in New England (which supports military families).
- \*30 Seniors went on to college as Music Majors.
- \*5 Seniors signed National Letters of Intent to play a sport on scholarship.
- \*Student Council was a National Gold Council of Excellence.
- \* LHS's NH Ranking: 8th of 90 schools and 4th in Division I.
- \*63 Adult Education graduates with the continued implementation of the alternative program.

Additionally, in the past 4 years, the district has implemented a 1:1 technology program in grades 6 through 12. This has been instrumental in providing more opportunities for our students to learn at higher levels and more opportunities for our staff to monitor how students are performing on grade level; in some cases, students are above those grade level skills.

Last year, the district added an elementary curriculum coordinator to work with K-5, to bring all our elementary schools to the next level with curriculum and consistency. In one year, this position has already brought much growth. Additionally, this coming year, a literacy program is being proposed to add more learning objectives and ties to the Science of Reading to our literacy program in grades 1-5. We will continue to run the Math Academy in the summer as well.

The district has been working on exploring full day kindergarten for over five years now, and this year, the decision will move forward to voters on the ballot. This opportunity for our younger students would provide 103 more days of learning for 5-year-olds. This will give our younger learners more opportunities in school to be better prepared for first grade, and for our students who receive services, more time in the classroom.

Our special education department has seen some growth in areas and continues to pursue qualified staff to be able to provide the best education for all our students. This year alone, our in-district specialized special education programs save our taxpayers upwards of 15 million dollars in this year's budget. In the upcoming year, 863 students will receive services in our district.

This year, the LHS Band was invited to London to march in the New Year's Parade—what a great honor and opportunity for our band members and families to experience! The LHS Varsity Baseball team won another State title as well.

All our PTAs and PTOs work tirelessly all year to help support all our students with field trips, book fairs, festivals and so many family events. This commitment is a true testament to how our community helps support all our schools.

We believe that we have one of the best school districts in the State, and we are very proud of this. Even with this excellence, we are always looking for new ways to improve in all areas. On behalf of the School Board, I would like to thank our administrators, faculty, and staff for their dedication that they bring to our students every day; to thank our community and parents for their continued support; to thank my colleagues who work tirelessly every day, dedicated to help the Londonderry School District become one of the premier districts in the state.

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

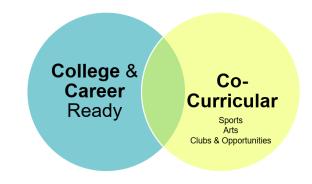
Looking at the FY 2024-2025 Budget and Warrant Articles going to the voters on March 12<sup>th</sup>, 2024, we are taking on a number of large structural problems we have in our community but doing so in a fiscally responsible way. That is a tough balance to maintain but we are confident the Londonderry Community will see our goals *and* fiscal prudence clearly.

#### **Continuing to Strengthen our Academic Program**

#### Londonderry School District Motto: Giving Wings to Children's Dreams

We are in our final year of our 2019- to 2024 Strategic Plan which has continued to strengthen our academic and co-curricular program for our students. Our Portrait of a Londonderry Graduate continues to be the North Star that guides this work and initiatives below.

As a reminder our Portrait of a Graduate is summarized in our **four competency areas** below:



- 1. **Our Graduates work well with others,** through communication and collaboration.
- 2. **Our Graduates think** critically, with creativity, and as problem solvers.
- 3 & 4. Our Graduates focus on themselves (through <u>self-direction</u>) and their communities (as an engaged citizen).

New Grades 1 to 5 Literacy Program: One specific investment to improve our academic program in this 2024-25 Budget is a near \$200K investment in our grades 1 to 5 reading, writing, speaking, and listening program for the future. Our elementary literacy program has been strengthened in recent years in the areas of foundational skills like phonics. This investment is the next step in that process. We have been piloting two specific programs in more than fifty classroom that are grounded in the "Science of Reading" that can help us move our numbers in the area of reading comprehension, vocabulary development, and writing about rigorous grade level texts. We have been building towards this investment over the last five years, which is when Reading Specialists and Administrators started to get trained in LETRS (a professional development program focused on aligned classroom practices to research and recent brain science). This spring 100% of our elementary staff will have completed, already started, or will start this LETRS training process for themselves. Pushing towards higher literacy outcomes for our elementary students that can carry into their middle and high school years is a huge structural challenge this budget, and this district are tackling.

More Advanced Math and Science Classes: At the other end of our school system, you will see a number of investments in the areas of advanced classes in Math and Science for our students as well. We have a near \$30K investment in new textbooks (electronic) for advanced placement science and math classes. This investment coincides with updates to both the Londonderry High School and Londonderry Middle School Program of Studies that will build clearer paths for students from 8<sup>th</sup> grade to Graduation to a larger range of advanced classes in both those subjects. We intend to come back in future with a similar approach in all the major departments we have in grades 6<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>.

Expanding our Career and Technical Options for Students: We are seeing growing interest from our students in terms of exploring all the pathways in front of them in Career and Technical Education. As a school system we also see our role in better expanding and providing for these pathways for our students while they are both at Londonderry Middle School and High School. For these reasons we have increased our investment in tuition for Career and Technical Education for our LHS students by \$30K in the upcoming budget. We hope to report continued growth for our students in the coming years.

Moving Our Numbers and Visiting Our Classrooms: Despite our strong comparison to neighboring and national school systems when we analyze local and national assessments; we want to do better in Londonderry. Our educators from grades K to 12 have been adopting a more focused look at our student outcomes in their staff and team level meetings so that we can better pinpoint the specific areas for growth and achievement as a school system. We believe this more focused use of our time will help *move our numbers* up to higher levels of achievement in all areas but especially from upper elementary through high school to ensure we have built that foundation in all our graduate to be successful in college and their careers.

Our District Wide Administrative team along with our Teachers and Allied Health groups have embarked an exciting new evaluation system. We have agreed as a system to have our administrators make many, unannounced "mini observations" of staff throughout the year to create a clearer picture of their strengths and areas to partner on with their administrators moving forward. This shift has allowed our administrators to spend more time in classrooms and having great pedagogical conversations with staff afterwards.

#### Thank You Londonderry for the past and ongoing Investments in Digital Learning

Over the last number of fiscal cycles, the generosity of the Londonderry Community has led to a dramatic shift in the digital learning we provide for our students.

- Right now, in grades 6 to 12 every student has their own devices that they can use in all of their classrooms.
- Grade 5 students have dedicated Chromebook carts that they can access at any time throughout the day.
- Grade Pre K to 4 have a dramatic increase in the number of grade appropriate devices they can access throughout their school day.
- All these current levels of investments are supported in an ongoing "replacement cycle" of devices that is built into our budgeting approach so that we never return to a state with outdated and unusable devices for staff and students.
- We now have *Digital Learning Specialists* at all school levels so that staff and students can be trained to maximize the educational value of these devices in any class.
- The Londonderry Community has continued to support a small IT Infrastructure Fund every year that ensures we constantly update our network to support all these devices.
- Our upper elementary, middle, and high school students and families have become proficient using Google Classroom to manage their learning in their classes.
- The new electronic textbooks and other digital curriculum resources are helping to align our curriculum to the Portrait of a Graduate while capitalizing on the devices and instructional practices we now have in place.

In short, we have made a lot of progress in the digital realm for our school system and students and will continue to do so in the future.

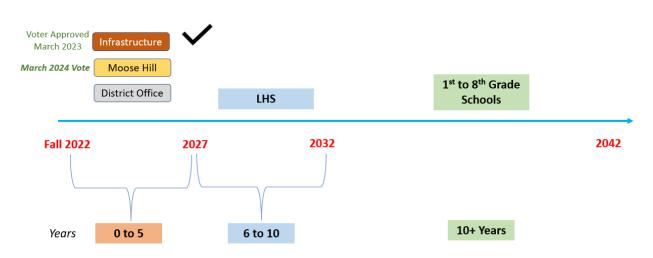
#### **Continued Long Term Planning for our School and Grounds**

Last year was the first step in approaching our long-term plan to keep our schools up to date and the high level of quality that the Londonderry Community expects.

With a high level of support from the Londonderry Community we were able to put in motion a \$5M Infrastructure project to address many of the oldest and most problematic parts of our heating and ventilation system across the district. Throughout the spring and summer, we went through a rigorous bidding process to be able to work with Energy Efficient Investments on this project (who have also helped the Town of Londonderry) We are on a path now to be done with all these upgrades by the fall of 2024 with their help.

### **Tentative Master Plan by Building Needs**

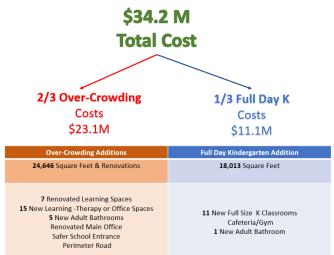

The Moose Hill Building Project is now the focus for the school system and Londonderry Community.

We proposed an operating budget that was \$154K below the default budget and one that included a net reduction of staff costs of -\$622K. We know the capital costs it will take to complete the Moose Hill Building project, so we made the operating budget as lean as possible while still being able to provide the academic and co-curricular programs the community expects.

On March 12<sup>th</sup>, 2024, the Londonderry Community will need to decide if we make a \$34.2M investment at Moose Hill to solve our two

most pressing space issues as a district:

2) Not being able to provide full day kindergarten like the majority of New Hampshire and the country. We are one of six school systems left in New Hampshire that do not provide Full Day Kindergarten.

The warrant article on Moose Hill is the second large structural issue we are trying to solve as a school system in this budget process.

We were able to arrive at this long-term plan for our school by first engaging in a Master Study for all our schools from 2020 to 2022. With this approach in mind, we currently have a \$60K investment in our operating budget so that we can study our extensive fields network of Londonderry High School, Londonderry Middle School, and Matthew Thornton to make sure we understand the current conditions of our fields that support our schools and our community's passion for sports. We hope to conduct that study in the next school year to be able to present the findings by this time next year.

As we continue down this path of (1) strengthening our academic program, (2) keeping up and excelling at shifting our curriculum to a more digital approach, and (3) investing in our old buildings to keep them in great shape, we do want to highlight some of the statistics that we monitor from year to year as a school system so that the community can see they are getting an excellent return on the investment in our schools.

The Curriculum Coordinating Council (C3) is an integral part of our District's mission that supports and connects curriculum, instruction, and professional development efforts of our individual schools at the Londonderry School District.

#### Report of the Curriculum Coordinating Council (C3)

#### I. The Mission of C3

The mission of the Curriculum Coordinating Council is to manage a process for continuously improving the alignment, development, and delivery of our curriculum K-12, such that we as a district can achieve our strategic objectives and accomplish our mission.

#### II. The Goals and Responsibilities of C3

The goals and responsibilities are to:

- 1. Identify curriculum issues
- 2. Examine materials and professional staff development options
- 3. Recommend to the Superintendent research-based and consensus-supported solutions for implementation

#### III. Organizational Structure of C3

The Council has approximately 20 educational professionals and community members who attend monthly C3 meetings established for the 2023-2024 school year. The Assistant Superintendent, Elementary Principals and/or Assistant Principals, and Curriculum Coordinators from Londonderry High School and Londonderry Middle School and the Elementary CC attend all meetings. These meetings have returned to in-person and are held in the Library Media Center at Londonderry High School. Community members are always welcome to join.

#### IV. Summary of C3 Activities, Discussions, and Actions

Our scheduled meeting for October 2023 focused on our Literacy Pilot updates at the elementary level, Chromebook use and the 1:1 Technology Initiative at LMS, and Dual Enrollment and Advanced Placement offerings at LHS. The December 2023 meeting will be devoted to discussing the potential of full-day Kindergarten and a facility to support it, with a presentation from that committee and members of the building committee. For the January meeting, we turn our attention to the district's "Portrait of a Graduate" and Competency-based Education in our schools. We will dedicate our March meeting to a literacy program recommendation and prepare for a winter data presentation. We will conclude our C3 meetings in May by focusing on social-emotional learning for students in the Londonderry School District.

#### **Technology Planning Process**

The 2023-24 School Year Budget, supported by the voters, allowed for the continued shift in how we plan for technology in the Londonderry School District. We now have a consistent funding source to replace aged out devices in our district. With these efforts, we were able to replace more than 600 devices district wide again. The plan is to continue these efforts with each successive budget cycle to ensure our staff and students have reliable hardware. Within this current plan, we have shifted to more mobile devices for staff and students that has also allowed us to remove some of the redundancy we had in the past with more stationary devices.

The 2023-24 School Year Budget also completed both the Londonderry High School, and Middle School's transition to a one-to-one model for students. In this school year, we now have all High School students using their own windows laptop and Middle School students using their own Chromebook. This has enabled more consistent, and flexible use of digital curriculum across all grade levels.

The 2023-24 School Year Budget also had the support from the taxpayers for a fund to update our infrastructure. This school year we focused on updating access points and switches to ensure reliable network connections as well as faster speeds with more data throughput. These updates have also allowed for more centralized network management to allow for quicker responses to any issues if they should arise.

With the support of the replacement cycle and infrastructure upgrades, each school building will have a more reliable and productive approach to technology in our curriculum. With this change, each school's technology committee has been tasked to articulate the curriculum and instructional practices that are working and spread them through each school. Each school's technology committee also works closely with the IT Department on supporting the vision of a digital age classroom as well as meeting the needs of a Portrait of a Graduate.

#### **Professional Development Opportunities**

The Council discusses and reviews the process that provides teachers the opportunity to offer professional development to other staff. Based on the needs of the district through the Strategic Plan's goals, priority areas, and objectives, presenting teachers would be compensated for planning and workshop time. Benefits for participating teachers include stretching an individual's tuition reimbursement funds as attendance cost would be nominal when compared to outside workshops. Additionally, workshops would support District curriculum and instruction in the classroom as well as provide participating teachers credit toward recertification.

# Londonderry School District Deliberative Session February 10, 2023

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Mrs. Conley, at 7:00 PM. The Londonderry Guard presented the flag and members of the Londonderry High School band played the National Anthem. Kerri Stanley, School District Clerk, of the Londonderry School District, led the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence followed in memory of Patti Downing, long time para-professional at Moose Hill School, and Corinne Murphy, LHS English teacher, as well as for our first responders who serve or have served.

Mrs. Conley requested cell phones be silenced and spoke about the available Exits, should there be an emergency and let people know to keep their ballots with them. She mentioned the second part of the town meeting will be held on Tuesday, March 4, 2022, at the Londonderry High School gym and that the polls will be open from 6 AM to 8 PM. She explained the Moderator's duties to run the Deliberative Session, rules of the meeting, and instructions for voter attendees' actions. She introduced the individuals at the head table.

Superintendent Dan Black presented the State of the School Address. He highlighted where we've been and what is ahead. Mainly, we are currently back to normal. A lot of work goes into running our schools and taking care of the more than 4100 students. We continue to improve our academic program, ensuring our students are career and college ready, and that they are well-rounded. We ensure that we provide an acceptable co-curricular program to learn outside the classroom as well. The Accent on Achievement handout provided statistics, charts and data that show the strength of these two parts of our school system and how strong our academic program is.

Mr. Black provided some statistics:

- 85-90% of our graduates in any given year are accepted into a two- or four-year degree program, usually reflective of 13 years, from kindergarten through 12th grade.
- Nearly 700 students enrolled in Advanced Placement and/or Running Start Classes at the high school
- We have been consistently above state and national averages on i-Ready, PSAT, SAT and NH Standardized tests

We also want to continue to get better at what we do. We want to ensure our students work well through communication and collaboration, critical thinking, creativity, and problem solving, self-direction, and can focus on themselves as engaged citizens. This vision is being embedded in all our curriculum work with the goal to make our learning experiences for all students more challenging and engaging.

We continue to improve our academic program, shifting our focus from math with grades K-8 to literacy to make sure we build more skilled readers, writers, and communicators for their 6 to 12 classes.

We are also working on rebuilding a positive school culture, integrating courage, gratitude, forgiveness, compassion in ultimately choosing love as a school system.

We are shifting our curriculum to a more digital format, which we've been able to do since the transition from COVID. In the Fall of 2023, Londonderry High School will be a 1:1 device-to-student environment, a goal achieved by having retired the majority of stationary computer labs for mobile devices for our staff and students. If voters approve Article 10, LMS will also be a 1:1 device-to-student environment with Chromebooks being supplied to students.

We have been working on improving our safety through the ALICE program, training our teachers and staff, and will be implementing this program with our students in collaboration with the Londonderry Police and Fire departments. Other improvements have been related to door locks, fixing perimeter access issues, thanks to the \$350K support from taxpayers last year and a \$560K SAFE Grant from New Hampshire. To complete these projects, we are asking for another \$350K in Warrant Article 7 to complete these projects in three remaining schools.

We have concern related to some mechanical issues with the schools that need to be addressed utilizing a 5M bond that is part of a tentative long-range plan for our old school buildings. The middle school boiler is 40 years old, with a life expectancy of 20-25 years. The high school boiler is now 38 years old with a life expectancy of 20 years. The South School boiler is 50 years old with a life expectancy of 20-25 years. We are functioning on borrowed time at the moment. If the Warrant Article 2 passes (requiring ¾ ballot vote), we have to bid out for the engineering of the projects which will be done during the spring. It would be the hope that by summer, we could actually start to bid on the projects. Updates won't be completed until at least summer of 2025.

Mrs. Conley introduced the members of the Budget Committee.

Mrs. Conley read Article 1 - Election of Officers would be decided on March 14, 2023.

Bob Slater, School Board member, made a motion to move Article 2 to the floor for discussion, seconded by Amy Finamore.

Amy Finamore, School Board Chair, presented the Article. If the bond is approved, it will take approximately 3 years to complete. The units currently in use have been in use for more than double their life expectancy. The equipment needs to be updated. Bidding processes will follow, and if passed, would be done during the summer of 2024 and summer of 2025. This article requires 60% of the vote to pass. If it fails and a boiler or other item fails, there will be no funds to repair them.

Steven Breault, 461 Mammoth Road, from the Budget Committee, stated the Budget Committee voted unanimously in favor of the proposed Warrant Article.

Ray Breslin, 3 Gary Drive, asked why this was put on for so long and feels we will be forced to address it now. He asked where the figures came from? Amy stated we can't put anything out to bid unless the Warrant Article was approved. Lisa McKenney stated that estimates came from one of our HVAC providers, which was corroborated by Mr. Black.

Mr. Breslin inquired about the pump house that was presented on the list and challenged this since we were talking about heating systems and said he doesn't see this as a priority. All heating systems in all schools are in danger of failing unless we spend the money now and asked how we came to this point. Mr. Black said this was due to the fact that we deferred addressing this until now.

Mr. Breslin asked about the South School and the possibility that it would be torn down and rebuilt. Mrs. Conley indicated that we would not be debating these issues, as this is done during budget meetings. Mr. Breslin stated that we needed additional information on this.

Kristine Perez, 5 Wesley Drive said she was amazed that we have equipment that is between 13 and 30 years past life expectancy. Since 1995, we have been putting hundreds to millions of dollars in the Capitol Improvement Fund. She clarified what was being asked for was a larger summer which would increase with each passing year. She stated that this bond would cost us \$356,667 over the next 15 years and asked what happens if the bond doesn't pass. Money would ultimately be found in an unfunded balance to use as the students would not be displaced. Since these funds are no longer returned to the town as has been the practice in the past, she stated she didn't think the bond would pass and put forth an amendment to reduce the Article bond to \$0 and educate people to take care of these things when they should be and not to wait.

Mrs. Conley asked for a second motion, seconded by Christine Fitzgerald, 242 Rockingham Road.

Mr. Patrick Cassidy, 12 Elwood Road, from the Budget Committee stated it shouldn't have gotten to this point, but noted we are trying to correct the problem by being responsible to plan ahead, so we aren't paying excessive amounts down the road or have to amend this as an emergent situation. It would not be practical to take the \$4M in the Unfunded Balance, as this amount would not cover these expenses. If we try to piece it out over the next decade, we will see repercussions and suggested that the bond be moved forward.

Sharon Carson, 19 Tokanel Drive, said she understood people's frustration and angst but asked if a maintenance plan were developed that would provide assurances that this wouldn't happen again in the future.

Mr. Black stated that a long-term plan was created. Ms. Carson suggested that this all be flushed out so the people know what the maintenance plan will look like and to plan for this type of issue.

Seeing no further discussion, Mrs. Conley read the amended Article, reducing the amount from \$5M to \$0, which failed by raised ballot.

Mrs. Conley asked for discussion on Warrant Article 2 as written and seeing none, made a motion to move the article to the ballot. Kristin Grages, 17 Sutton Place, made a motion to restrict reconsideration, seconded by a member from the Budget Committee.

(<6) for next year, which reflects a fairly steady enrollment and said this is what really determined how they came to this bottom-line budget. He also touched on additional specialty staff members that were required that included a school psychologist. Through retirements, attritions, five reductions and a few additions, they came to this budget. 180K saved in electricity costs by updating lighting to LED. P 17-18 of the Information Packet show details that include a \$400K gap between the proposed and default budgets. The reduction or elimination of some co-curricular and academic programs had to be addressed to address this \$400K gap.

Mr. Breault from the Budget Committee stated the Budget Committee voted unanimously in favor of the proposed budget.

Deb Paul, 118 Hardy Road, asked when they were determining enrollment, did they take into consideration the 500+ proposed apartments which have the potential of increasing student enrollment.

Mr. Black commented that enrollment is one of the most challenging factors when determining the budget. The changes are most noted in kindergarten,1st, and 9th grades, respectively. If the enrollment numbers were to increase, they would have to adapt to it, as they were not projected for the 2023-2024 school year budget.

Ken Samoisette, 4 Faucher Road, asked for clarification on the last budget item regarding the classroom being a temporary container classroom going to the North School which may impact how people vote, knowing this could remove the music curriculum out of the North School and move it to the portable classroom for the benefit of 7 total students. Mrs. Finamore stated there are currently two being used at Moose Hill and that her own child used one of these portable classrooms when at Moose Hill and contended it was suitable. We have photographs of those at Moose Hill and would expect these would be as equitable in both space and design.

Nancy Hendricks, 14 King John Drive, asked in respect to enrollment, sometimes there are bubbles that pop up where additional teachers are required, and does this budget allow for this possibility. Mr. Black said they would tap into their fund balance if this was needed.

Seeing no further discussion, Article 3 was moved to the ballot. Kristin Grages made a motion to restrict reconsideration, seconded by Tim Seikmann, 89 Hovey Road, of the Budget Committee. The motion passed by a raised vote ballot.

A majority of the work is completed by the custodial team in approximately 677,000 square feet of buildings and approximately 50 to 75 acres of fields. The work includes but is not limited to landscaping, field and playground maintenance, snow removal, day to day maintenance, repairs of various systems, electrical, lighting, HVAC, safety, painting, assembly, and deliveries, and moves and future planning. Given the age of some of our buildings, more work is required over the course of the year to maintain them. We do see savings since they are in house HVAC and electrician certified, eliminating the need to have to outsource projects. He stated that they were willing to take a higher copay on a new insurance plan to save the district money.

We have audited, in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Londonderry, New Hampshire School District, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Londonderry, New Hampshire School District's basic financial statements, and have issued our report thereon dated December 22, 2023.

#### Report on Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered the Londonderry, New Hampshire School District's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Londonderry, New Hampshire School District's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Londonderry, New Hampshire School District's internal control.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified.

#### **Report on Compliance and Other Matters**

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Londonderry, New Hampshire School District's financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the financial statements. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

#### **Purpose of this Report**

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control or on compliance. This report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the entity's internal control and compliance. Accordingly, this communication is not suitable for any other purpose.
